

# NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Town of Madison will conduct a public hearing by the Board of Selectmen on Tuesday, May 24, 2022 at 6:00 p.m. in Town Campus Room A, located at 8 Campus Drive, Madison, CT to discuss the Fiscal Year 2019 Community Development Block Grant program and to solicit citizen input.

The purpose of the public hearing is to provide information and obtain citizen's views on the progress of the Grant under the Public Housing Modernization category for the Concord Meadows HVAC improvements and Window replacement in buildings 10-12 which was funded under the Connecticut Small Cities Community Development Block Grant Program which is a federally funded program designed to assist governments with activities directed toward neighborhood and housing revitalization, economic development, and improved community facilities and services.

Also, the public hearing will give citizens an opportunity to make their comments known on the program and for approval of the Program Income Reuse Plan.
